Important Notes

***The credits of English language recognized following this system are not counted to satisfy the graduation requirements. They will be considered as the Free Elective Courses.**

*The maximum number of credits that can be awarded based on proficiency test results is six for English and Japanese combined.

*Awarded credits under this system shall be included in the maximum of 60 other university credits that may be recognized by Nagoya University.

*About necessary credits of the Language and Culture Courses for completion, please consult the Student Affairs office of your department.
